MOOSEHEART BABY VILLAGE--A CHILDREN'S WORLD

One of the highlights of any tour of Mooseheart is a visit to the Pennsylvania Baby Village. It is here that boys and girls ranging from infancy through age four make their home in surroundings specially designed for their comfort and security.

Here, chairs, tables, beds and chests, to the four diminutive commodes in each hall, have been made to accommodate the short legs and small bodies of these young ones.

A nursery theme has been used in decorating the interiors of the four buildings, with soft carpeting on the floors and lower walls to cushion uncertain toddler steps.

Thanks to the Pennsylvania Moose Association and the Women of the Moose, all four halls received full renovations in the early- and mid-1990s. Susquehanna and Schuylkill were renovated first, followed by work on Juniata and Allegheny. All four Halls are named after rivers in Pennsylvania.

Each hall has its own television set and VCR, and there are toys, dolls, stuffed animals and children's books throughout. Weather permitting, the youngsters play in the sandboxes and heart-shaped wading pool, on the swings and other playground equipment, ride their tricycles and wagons, and engage in games and contests.

Life is not all play for the children at the Baby Village. Three- and four-year-olds attend nursery school, in a fifth building right in their Village. At the age of five, they advance to kindergarten, and at the age of six, they begin first grade

Each child has his or her own individual youth-sized bed, with cribs for the youngest. During the day, a favorite doll or stuffed animal keeps watch over the bed, but at night, the same item is generally found cuddled in the arms of its youthful owner.

Each child has his or her own drawer, hanger space and "eubby hole" where personal toys and books are kept.

Built by the Lodges of Pennsylvania, the Baby Village was dedicated August 22, 1922. They are arranged in the form of a heart. The five buildings are one-story structures of concrete blocks with red tile roofs.

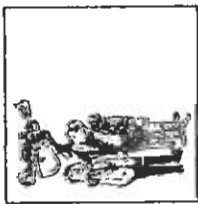

Our student guide was a young girl of about 12 or 13 yrs. who had lived at Mooseheart since she was a babe in arms. Her father had been killed when she was one week old. She and fourteen of her brothers and sister, along with her mother moved to Mooseheart. Between them they had a collective 147 years of residence. This awe inspiring story coupled with seeing and absorbing the whole environment of the Child City ensured I would never not be a moose member.

This was a unique event and unfortunately, there are not too many such occasions to generate a visit. However there is one occasion each year when all Ohio members have the opportunity to make a visit. **This Is Founders Weekend**, organized in part by the Ohio State Moose Association. Many bus loads of Ohio Moose Members will descend upon our Child City on **Oct. 24th to the 26th**. This is a great weekend away and the very best opportunity the see and understand first hand what we as a fraternity are all about.
